



## COVID ANNOUNCEMENT

In light of the latest announcement on the reintroduction of measures to control the spread of the Covid-19, we felt it important to outline how we at SportyStars interpret our position within the altered landscape.

Boris Johnson, in his statement on Tuesday 8th September, announced that social gatherings of people in groups larger than six will be banned from Monday 14th September. He also announced that there would be some specific exemptions including organised sport, education, weddings and funerals. As before our Holiday Camps are classed as childcare and we continue to deliver these, as we did in the Summer Holidays.

After studying the latest information provided, we are confident that our core party activities fall into the category of 'Organised Team Sport', for the following reasons:

- Each of our groups are provided with a date, time, venue and activity-leader (coordinator) for their activity so are therefore 'organised'
- Our activities are variations of Football, Archery, Dodgeball and Others, so therefore each is classified as a 'sport'
- Groups rarely exceed 30 and as of 14th September, we will not be accepting any bookings for groups above this number (until restrictions are eased)
- Activities take place in Covid-secure venues
- Our activities have been risk assessed and accepted as Covid-secure
- The Bouncy castle will be the only activity not available for groups larger than 6

As a result of this interpretation, we are pleased to say that our activities are exempt from the 'Rule of Six' and as such will continue to deliver our activities as we were prior to the announcement. We will of course, continue to monitor the guidance and if the landscape changes again, we will communicate any impact that this may have on our ability to run activities. For now though, to confirm, we are **OPEN FOR BUSINESS**.

I hope that this provides some clarity on our position and we are looking forward to continuing working with you on this basis.
